Our outreach in Richmond and beyond has grown, providing deeper connections to God and our fellow human beings. Our expanded liturgical offerings have welcomed new people to St. Stephen's, and we have lived into a phrase we have all become accustomed to hearing, "Whoever you are, wherever you come from, we are glad you are here." The process of calling a new rector, which typically takes 15 to 20 months, involves parish self-reflection as well as the careful examination of candidates. This process will no doubt be informed by the parish-wide process we conducted before the pandemic, called "Envisioning Our Future." We will update you on the search process in the coming weeks.

In the meantime, we are blessed that the Rev. Will Stanley, the Rev. Claudia Merritt, the Rev. Cate Anthony, the Rev. David Knight, and soon the Rev. John Jenkins, will help lead us forward, with our talented and hardworking lay staff. It is a great team, and we are thankful for each of them.

We fully support Gary's decision to focus on the next exciting stage of his life, and to be able to devote more time to family and friends. He has given so much to so many! We also want to acknowledge and thank Cherry for her support and her many contributions to our community as well.
